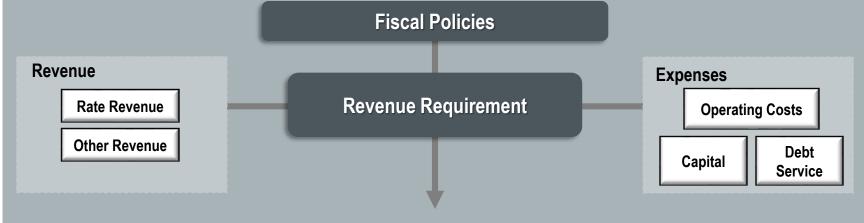

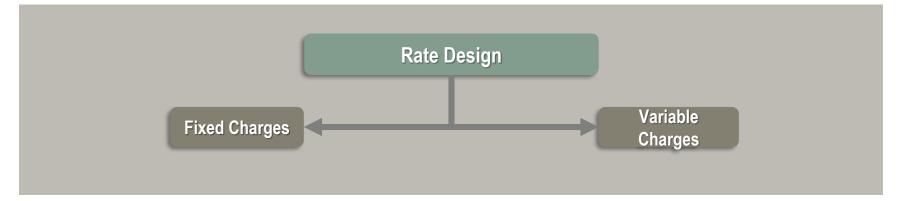


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- 2009 rate study recommended a series of rate increases to cover anticipated operating and capital needs
- Council opted to implement CPI adjustments in Jan 2011 and Jan 2012, deferring larger increases until mid-2012









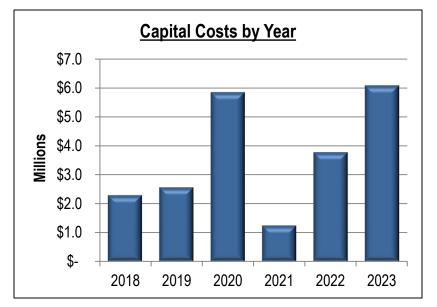

ORDINANCE NO. 1606

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BONNEY LAKE, PIERCE COUNTY, WASHINGTON, AMENDING CHAPTER 13.04 OF THE BONNEY LAKE MUNICIPAL CODE AND THE CORRESPONDING PORTIONS OF ORDINANCE NOS. 692 AND 1277 RELATING TO ANNUAL WATER RATE ADJUSTMENTS.

WHEREAS, the City has recently completed updated comprehensive plans for the water and sewer systems; and

WHEREAS, the City has recently had a utility rate study completed by the Financial Consulting Services Group; and

WHEREAS, the Washington Department of Health, which has jurisdiction over public water systems, has imposed a number of system improvements as a condition to state approval of the City's Water Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that as a result of these comprehensive studies water rates need to be increased in order to assure consumers a continued safe and reliable water system;

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BONNEY LAKE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. BLMC Section 13.04.105 and corresponding portions of ordinance Nos. 692 and 1277 is hereby amended to read as follows:

13.04.105 Annual rate adjustment.

Effective January 1st of each year, beginning on January 1, 2019 through January 1, 2023, the water rates listed in BLMC 13.04.100 shall be adjusted upwards by eight and one-half percent (8.5%).

Effective January 1st of each year, beginning on January 1, 200924, the water rates listed in BLMC 13.04.100 shall be adjusted by the annual change in the most recent Seattle-Bremerton-Tacoma Area Consumer Price Index (Urban Consumers) published by the U.S. Department of Labor.

<u>Section 2. Severability</u>. If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance.

<u>Section 3</u>. The Mayor is hereby authorized to implement such administrative procedures as may be necessary to carry out the directions of this legislation.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after final passage. The adjusted water rates enacted by this ordinance shall be applied beginning January 1, 2019.
